We believe that our heritage is worth maintaining, any change should enhance the town and collectively we can make a difference. We are funded by subscriptions and voluntary contributions.

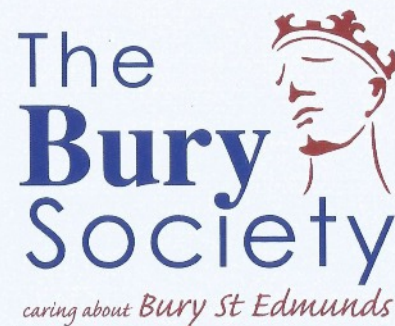
